### Why is this an issue for Van Loon Group?

The European Union is very cautious about the use of Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs). In addition, a number of customers demand GMO-free products.

### Scope

This concerns the raw materials and auxiliary materials that are processed into end products.

### Our policy

Van Loon Group works with our partners in the supply chain to ensure that products are free from genetically modified ingredients or their derivatives.


Our procurement requirements therefore stipulate that every raw material and ingredient must be free from genetically modified ingredients or their derivatives. By signing procurement specifications, suppliers commit to our policy.

Depending on our risk analysis and/or customer-specific requirements, we carry out analyses on raw materials and/or finished products

The availability of non-genetically modified crops is a complex issue and we are aware that our policy must remain up to date. We will therefore endeavour to keep abreast of international developments and the availability of GMO-free crops.
